- The wool bale competitor rides in the wheelbarrow.

2. Pour into a loaf tin, well greased and lined on the sides
3. Bake at 180C for 50 minutes or until baked through
4. Ice with White Icing

Your loaf tin should fill to at least 2/3 rds to achieve a well risen loaf.

RICH FRUIT CAKE RECIPE

Ingredients

250g Sultanas
250g Chopped Raisins
250g Currants
125g Chopped Mixed Peel
90g Chopped Red Glaze Cherries
90g Chopped Blanched Almonds
1/3 cup Sherry or Brandy
250g Plain Flour
60g Self – Raising Flour
¼ Teaspoon Grated Nutmeg
½ Teaspoon Ground Ginger
½ Teaspoon Ground Cloves
250g Butter
250g Soft Brown Sugar
½ Teaspoon Lemon Essence or Finely Grated Lemon Rind
½ Teaspoon Almond Essence
½ Teaspoon Vanilla Essence
4 Large Eggs

Method

1. Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight.
2. Sift together the flours and spices. Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences.
3. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after, each addition, then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly.
